


#### **BLENDED LEARNING TRACKING PHOTO EXAMPLES**

The photo examples here are organized by content provider, but keep in mind that these tracking examples can be adapted to any content provider that you are using.

## iReady





iReady Lesson Tracker - Students mark off each lesson they pass with an "X" and fill in a star for lessons passed with 100 percent







Students put up a sticker on their individual trackers each time they pass a lesson







Daily lesson tracker - Students move their magnet or photo each time they pass a lesson









Weekly iReady lesson trackers - Students move their photo or earn a sticker each week they pass their iReady lesson goal








Students put a sticker or write their name when they pass a lesson at 100 percent

Lexia



Students created boats with their nicknames on them. When students level up on Lexia, they move their boat to the next level!

Individual Lexia tracker







Lexia Certificate Wall - print out and post Lexia certificates as students level up




Examples of ways to track how many words students have read throughout the year






Lesson tracker with a goal of one hundred lessons or more




Tracker with lesson average and combo goals


Lesson tracker by week with goal




Tracking missions (levels on Zearn) with student rockets










Examples of how to track student Lexile level and Lexile growth throughout the year

The graphs track lexile growth and individual lessons are tracked on the owls with a tally marks for every ten lessons passed at 75 percent or better










Students move their picture the amount of lexile growth they've made since the beginning of the school year.

Chart to show students the connection between Lexile level and grade




Chart to show students the connection between lessons passed and average Lexile growth

Example leaderboard - shows students with the most lessons passed




Lesson tracker - shows total lessons passed by each student











Students get a star for every two lessons passed.

Students keep track of their progress on content providers each week and overall progress




# Weekly Lesson Tracker






Here are example trackers that are updated weekly to show student progress on lessons








Students receive a sticker for each lesson passed. When they meet their weekly goal, their picture is placed on the Record Book bulletin board.









Students move their magnets after they pass a lesson. After they meet their weekly goal, they move their magnet to the prize of their choice.
